



Adopting a Cat? What to expect.

No doubt you're looking forward to years of happy companionship. The first thing you should know about your new pet is that most cats dislike travelling. For the trip home and all future travels, confine your pet in a cat carrier and do not open it during the trip.

The First Day: Your new cat has just spent some time living in a small area awaiting adoption. She may not be used to large, open spaces and may become scared or overwhelmed if released into your entire home. Therefore, it is best to keep her confined to one room or a small area to start with. When you arrive home with your new cat, go into the designated room, close the door, and set the carrier down. Open the carrier door and then remain quietly nearby to see if she will emerge. Don't force her to come out; let her come out on her own. Some cats may not come out until nighttime. It's not uncommon for cats to want to stay in the carrier, however make sure she has access to food, water and a litter box.

The Following Days: As a rule, cats are upset by changes in their environment. Some cats adjust more quickly, while others may take weeks or months. You must have the patience and understanding to allow your cat to adjust at her own pace. When you first bring her home your cat is likely to hide - this is why you need to provide a safe, comfortable place where she can retreat.

Spend as much time in the room with her as you can. When your cat seems happy to see you and is confident and friendly in her limited environment, it is time to introduce her to the next area if she is the only pet. Signs that she may be ready include scratching or meowing at the door and trying to run out when you open the door.

Even if your cat has decided she wants to explore, she may still be easily frightened by sudden noises or too much open space. Keep your cat's original space set up exactly as it has been, so she has a refuge that is familiar to her. This feeling of familiarity is very important to cats. Cat behaviorists indicate that it takes two months for most cats to become totally at home in their new environment.

Volunteer Spotlight





Cat Words Answers



Whiskers!

- Are extremely sensitive
- Are on the nose, eyes, chin and back of front legs
- Help the cat figure out if they will fit through spaces
- Help the cat position their prey
- Position of whiskers indicate the cat's mood
 - Relaxed and to the side, the cat is calm
 - Flattened against face, the cat is scared
 - Pushed forward, the cat is excited
- Should never be cut as your cat will become disorientated without the vital information it receives from its whiskers
- Can change color with age
- Will occasionally shed a few whiskers
- Can detect even the slightest change in a breeze
