MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIRPERSON

It sometimes seems hard to believe that Sheltering Hands is almost a "teenager". Looking back over the past twelve years, Like the "teenager" we almost are, we we take pride in the efforts of so many volunteers, donors, staff and Board members. Working together, we have helped tens of thousands of cats and the working with an expert in small, nonpeople who care for them. Some highlights from our past:

- We have provided Trap-Neuter-Return ("TNR") services to over 10,000 cats! In doing so, we have easily prevented more than 100,000 cats from being born homeless and unwanted.
- We have placed over 2000 cats and kittens in loving adoptive homes.
- In our unique Seniors for Seniors program, we have placed more than 100 older cats with seniors who very much wanted a pet but were concerned about what would happen to their beloved companion if they were no longer able to care for it. Problem solved! That wellloved cat comes back to Sheltering Hands!
- Generous donations and support allowed us to buy and refurbish a

clinic on US Highway 27 where we perform our TNR surgeries.

Our Board is creating strategic plans that will better align our work with the needs of our area and provide a solid framework for the future of our organization. I'm Adoptable!



records from any internet connected device. No more searching for paper, no delay in examining records or finding information.

- All adoptable cats are now online and viewable from all major online adoption websites. This has significantly increased our number of adoptions.
 Potential adoptive families can even fill out their preadoption form online!
- With cat health and welfare as our primary focus, we have adopted and implemented the Five Freedoms* to provide the highest quality of life we can for our cats as they await their forever home.
- We are partnering with other area rescues to increase and supplement our efforts. By working together, the cats benefit.
- In a joint project with LeAF (Levy County Animal Friends), we will be providing low-cost spay/neuter services to cats in Levy County.
- We have added to our medical team and now have both our TNR surgical team of vets and a wellness vet who provides day-to-day care at her clinic for our adoptable and senior-for-senior cats. In addition, she will be making "house calls" on a monthly basis to monitor the health of all cats at our facility.

Working with our team of caring veterinarians, we have arranged for specialists to come to our facility to operate on cats with special needs. This provides us with a significant cost savings by providing the facility, equipment and support techs for the surgeon. Surgery that might have been cost prohibitive is now better within reach.

Like teenagers we have areas where we need to do better. That starts with listening and learning. Over the coming weeks, we will continue to listen and reach out to our stakeholders and fellow cat lovers. With your help and support, we will continue to work to help Sheltering Hands grow and better serve the needs of cats and those who love them. If you have been a past supporter, THANK YOU and we want you to continue to be a part of our family. If you have never had the chance to see what we do, we invite you to contact us and see how you can be a part of our growing family of animal advocates.
